<p>Monroe County Dispatch Center toned out Key Largo Fire and notified us that they had received a call from an alarm company stating that their system was indicating smoke in the storage room of the first floor of a residence at 555 Ocean Dr. The correct address was later discovered to actually be 555 Ocean Cay Dr. Units responding from Key Largo Fire were ENGINE-24, ENGINE-25, TANKER-24, and Chief-24. Units responding drove to the end of Ocean Dr. and did not locate the house number. At the end of this street there is a security gate so Chief-24 asked dispatch to provide the access code so fire units could try to locate the address on Ocean Cay Dr. Dispatch advised that the alarm company was reporting smoke on the second and third floor of the residence.</p> <p>Chief-24 located 555 Ocean Cay Dr. and did not see smoke showing as the residence was almost completely closed up with storm shutters so a 360 degree walk around was conducted of the residence. There was a slight smell of smoke and a window on the Bravo side was hot to the touch so Chief-24 established command and asked dispatch to tone for Tavernier Fire Engine-22 to respond. Engine-24 crew forced the double door to the storage room and entered the home with a charged 1 3/4" line and a thermal imaging camera to aid in seeing through the thick smoke. The power and gas to the home was shut down. Engine-25 crew was designated as the RIT and also pulled a second line and set up a ladder to the second floor Alpha side as a secondary means of egress. Tanker-24 staged at the corner next to the hydrant. Interior crew had to force a second door that led to the first floor entertainment area and located the fire coming from the area under the counter where the mini-refrigerator / ice maker was located. The fire was extinguished and the crew continued to search the residence for occupants and fire extension. Once the residence was searched and no occupants found, salvage and overhaul including venting the residence was performed by crews from Key Largo and Tavernier.</p> <p>The County Fire Marshal responded to investigate the origin and cause of the fire. The alarm company did not have a valid contact number for the home owner so the boats FL numbers were run and a contact number was found. The home owner was called and a message was left on the voice mail.</p> <p>Fire damage was limited to the area of origin. Smoke and heat damage was also limited to the floor of origin. There was minor smoke damage to the second and third floor.</p> <p>Estimated property damage estimated: \$75,000                      Content damage estimated at: \$20,000                      Key Largo Rescue-23 also responded. 
